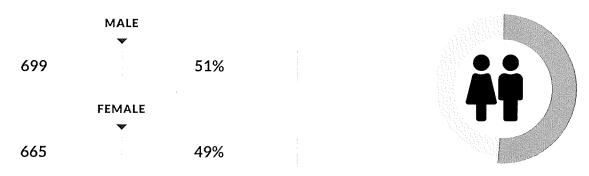

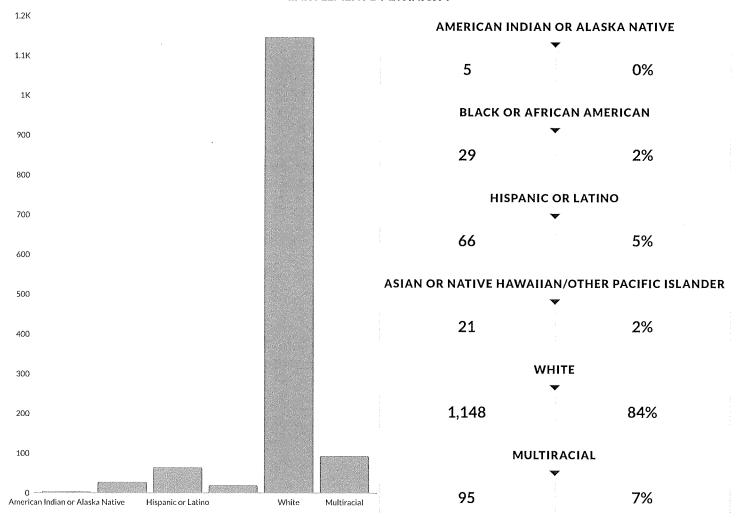
DRYDEN CSD ENROLLMENT (2019 - 20)

ENROLLMENT BY GENDER



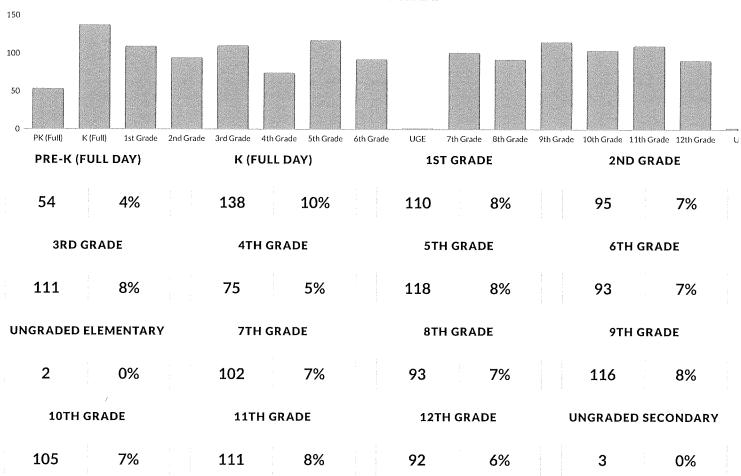
ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY

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DRYDEN CSD - NEW YORK STATE REPORT CARD [2019 - 20]

The New York State Report Card is an important part of the Board of Regents' effort to create educational equity and raise learning standards for all students. 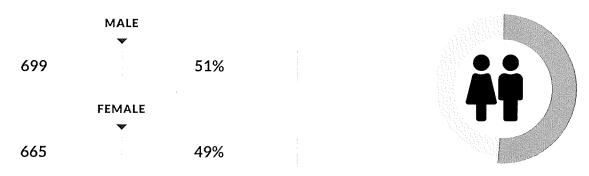

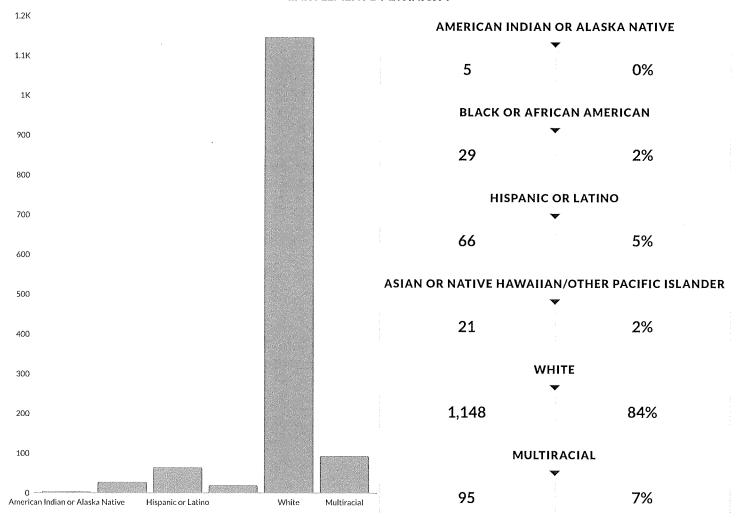
DRYDEN CSD ENROLLMENT (2019 - 20)

ENROLLMENT BY GENDER



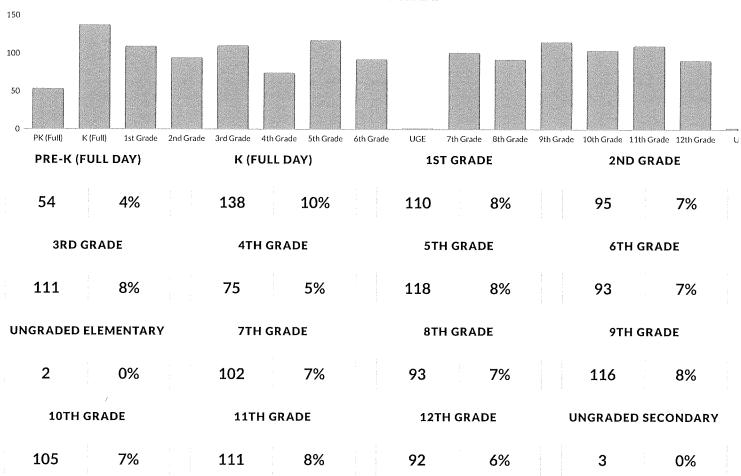
ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY
