BUDGET PRIORITIES:

- Maintain current program offerings and student opportunities while rightsizing expenditures through retirement, attrition, and consolidation.
- Balance the use of revenues, tax levy, fund balance, attrition and consolidation to maintain the fiscal health of the District while recovering from the pandemic, as well as preparing for long term fiscal concerns and District goals.






2023-2024 PROPOSED BUDGET (BOE Adopted 4/17/23)

\$45,311,906	\$46,827,740	\$1,515,834	3.35%

- Budget decreases: Debt Service
- Budget increases: Staff salaries per various contract agreements; required benefit increases (Retirement, Health Insurance, Social Security); BOCES services; auto/liability insurance, fuel, AED updates.

Please remember that the Board of Education approved a 2020-2021 budget that had **NO TAX LEVY INCREASE** at the beginning of the pandemic.

19-20 TAX LEVY = \$18,746,819

20-21 TAX LEVY = \$18,746,819

21-22 TAX LEVY = \$19,266,894

22-23 TAX LEVY = \$19,784,587

23-24 TAX LEVY = \$20,397,856

8.81% total increase over the 19-20 budget = 2.20% Average Annual Increase





- 2023-2024 Contingency Budget: \$46,214,471
- Budget Increase: 1.99%
- Tax Levy Increase: 0%
- Additional Required Contingency Cuts:

A contingency budget eliminates all non-contingent items such as student supplies, equipment and certain salary increases. Building use fees will be increased to cover all costs incurred by the District for use of buildings or grounds. Typically a contingency budget requires additional reductions to Program, Administrative and Capital Components to maintain a 0% increase to the tax levy as required by law.

Proposition No. 1

2023-2024 SPENDING PLAN

Shall the following resolution be adopted, to wit:

RESOLVED: That the Dryden Central School District, as recommended by the Board of Education, adopt a spending plan for the 2023-2024 school year in the amount of **\$46,827,740** and to levy the necessary tax therefor?

Proposition No. 2

SCHOOL BUS BOND PROPOSITION

Shall the Bus Bond Proposition set forth in the legal notice of this meeting authorizing the purchase of school buses and other transportation vehicles at a maximum cost of \$495,000 and providing that such sum shall be raised by a tax collectable in annual installments with District obligations to be issued in anticipation thereof, be approved?





Proposition No. 3

ALTERATIONS & IMPROVEMENTS AT FREEVILLE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL CAPITAL PROJECT PROPOSITION

Shall the proposition set forth in the legal notice of this meeting authorizing expending up to \$100,000 for alterations to the building's domestic water system and building security improvements at the Freeville Elementary School, with up to \$20,000 of such cost to be expended from the existing building capital reserve fund and the balance of such cost, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be funded by state aid available, all as more fully described in said notice, be approved?
